**Note:**

1959: It has not been possible to identify any specific policies associated with Clark's candidature, although he did comment to the *Harrow Observer* that he was "uneasy about some of the things going on in the district." He had been a Civic Centre Opposition Movement Councillor for Headstone ward (1935-36) and a Conservative and later Independent Conservative Councillor for Harrow-on-the-Hill and Greenhill ward (1946-48).

1961: (29/6) Macaulay died on 27 May 1961, the day after he was elected as an Alderman and appointed Mayor.
