**Note:**

1990: Grant resigned from the Council's Conservative Group in December 1991 with Cllr. Paul Blakeley (Centenary). They formed a group called "The Minority Conservatives". The split followed disagreements within the local Conservative Party about the proposed level of Community Charge for 1992-93, with both Grant and Blakeley calling for additional spending cuts so as to keep it to a minimum.

Cowan joined the Minority Conservatives in February 1992 and was chosen as leader of the group.

Grant and Cowan rejoined the official Conservative Group upon the dissolution of the Minority Conservative Group in December 1992.

Subsequent to the election Miss Plester became Mrs. Bartrick upon her marriage.
