1954: At the meeting of the Council held on 25 June 1954 lots were drawn to determine the person (24/6) elected to fill the vacancy with the longer term. This was done by the members concerned drawing slips of paper bearing the year of retirement from books held by the Town Clerk. The result was that Atherton was determined to fill the vacancy with the term ending in 1957, while Stenhouse was determined to fill the vacancy with the term ending in 1956.

1961- W.H. Jones was the candidate of the Central Harrow Residents' Association. A slogan that he
used, in 1961, was "H for Harrow": this was a reference to his middle initial, the intention being to avoid confusion with his similarly-named Conservative opponent, W.E. Jones.
