Note:

1934-1938: The main RA group in the ward was the Harrow Ratepayers' Association.

1939: Travers received support from Frank Clark.

1948: Clark, who was Chairman of the Public Health Committee, did not receive the endorsement of the local Conservative Association despite his assertion that he was as "100 per cent Conservative as anyone in Harrow."

1948: Clark resigned from the Council as a protest at the continuation of controlled refuse tipping on the redundant Wealdstone sewage farm and filter beds.

(19/6) Dexter, reported to be a member of the local Conservative Association, received support from Clark and from the Sudbury Hill (Harrow) Residents' Circle.
