Note: On 7 November 1924 Lloyd-Greame changed his surname to Cunliffe-Lister so as to be able to inherit property from his wife's family.

Note: There has been uncertainty surrounding Grant's name. *Craig's British Parliamentary Election Results, 1885-1918* lists him as "J.C. Grant"; Leigh Rayment as "Corrie Brighton Grant"; and *Debrett's House of Commons and the Judicial Bench 1901* as "Corrie Grant", the son of James Brighton Grant. During the 1899 by-election the Harrow local press only ever referred to him as "Corrie Grant" and Grant is also shown as such in the *London Gazette* returns of the 1900 and 1906 General Elections, when he was elected MP for the Rugby division of Warwickshire. However, *Registers of Electors* for the Acton Parliamentary division of Middlesex from the early 1920s confirm that Grant's full name was Corrie Brighton Grant — he lived at an address in The Avenue, Bedford Park, Acton.
