Note: The Parish Meeting to elect councillors was held at the Parish Hall on 17 March with Mr. Ernest A. Jelf in the Chair during the election.

Once the voting figures were known, Watson asked that his name be withdrawn and for Dowsing to take his place, but the Chairman ruled this request to be out of order. However, the Chairman then allowed Haynes to withdraw his candidature, signing a notice to that effect. Dowsing filled the vacancy and a poll was not demanded.

Note: Cllr. Watson proposed and Cllr. Sharman seconded that Wood be chosen to fill one of the vacancies; Cllr. Wilde proposed and Cllr. Beaumont seconded that Smith be chosen; and Cllr. Watson proposed and Cllr. Dowsing seconded that Haynes be chosen. With each continuing councillor having two votes, the voting was Haynes 5 votes, Wood 3 votes and Smith 3 votes. The Chair declared Haynes elected; as there was a tie for the second position he exercised a casting vote in favour of Wood.

Sainsbury, Greenaway, Bendall and Pole sought election on a joint 'ticket' and were supported by a group of Headstone electors. Palmer, Watson, Miss Hill, Dowsing, Wood and Fuller sought election on a separate 'ticket' and were supported by a group of Pinner Village electors. H.W.W. Beaumont was supported by the British Legion. Sharman withdrew from the election but too late to have his name excluded from the ballot paper.

Note: The Ward Meeting to elect councillors was held at St. George's Church Hall, on 13 March, with Mr. J. Vincent Howells in the Chair during the election. The *Minutes* of the meeting recorded that "about 50 Ratepayers were present."

Originally nomination papers were received for a total of eight candidates: six were those of Collington, Bendall, Skinner, Wells, Hales and Young. The other two nominees, both Labour Party members, were Arthur Heffer and John A. Turner; however, on examination of the papers the Chairman declared them to be invalid. The substitution of nomination papers for Mulhall and Terry was allowed.

A poll was demanded, which confirmed those elected at the meeting. Hales, Mulhall, Young and Terry were nominated by the Labour Party.
