At the Poll you are absolutely free and perfectly safe Working men, remember it is your cause I am fighting." Paine was strongly opposed to the canvassing methods of the supporters of Bridgwater.

Short, under the slogan 'Union is Strength', called for workers to be represented on public bodies. In an advert in the *Wealdstone, Harrow and Wembley Observer* he said: "Doubtless you will have had all the young and old ladies in the place courting you for your vote; but only for that. Then good-bye till next election day, or till they want something else. If Workmen are true to their principles and act together they can win any election." After the election Short said that his supporters should not be disheartened by the result. "Considering the terrible combination against us, i.e. all the wealth of the Harrow Primrose District, and other Ladies, Parsons included, vehicles out [in] number, and working-men who dearly love a rich one, we have not done so badly."

The *Hendon and Finchley Times* described Robinson as a “well-known Conservative worker in the Harrow Division” — at the time of the election he was Secretary of the Great Stanmore Conservative Association.
