HARROW WARD STATISTICS: 2026 ELECTORAL EQUALITY

This Table explores the electoral equality of Harrow's wards in 2026, and should be read in conjunction with Table 6. As before, a ward that is 'under-represented' displays a +ve variance from the average number of electors per Councillor, while an 'over-represented' ward has a -ve variance.

Three wards — Greenhill, Marlborough and Wealdstone South — were the only wards that showed noteworthy electorate growth. Edgware, a ward that was notably under-represented in 2022, lost an unusually large number of electors (786) to now have an electors per councillor ratio in satisfactory alignment with the borough average.
