The *Hendon and Finchley Times* reported that "a huge crowd" was in attendance, while the Minutes recorded that "approximately 200-250 [were] present." A poll was not demanded.

Seabrook, Robertson, Mrs. Allen, Walker and Barclay were the candidates of the local Conservative Association; Barclay was also endorsed by the Ratepayers' Association. Rust, Newham, Black and Mrs. Jones were candidates of the Ratepayers' Association.

Note: The Parish Meeting to elect councillors was held on 9 March at St. Lawrence's Church Hall with Brigadier-General John H. Abbot Anderson in the Chair during the election. One elector (a Mr. P. Page) demanded a poll but the Chairman refused after taking the views of the Meeting.

The Minutes of this meeting being unavailable, the voting figures above are those reported by the *Hendon and Finchley Times*. The paper also commented that the election was an "outstanding success" for the Little Stanmore Ratepayers' Association without being specific about which candidates were endorsed by the organisation.

Fawcett and Allen were the candidates of the local Labour Party.
