Note:

1974: Although Roxbourne Labour Party wished to nominate Davies as one of their candidates, he did not receive the endorsement of the Local Government Committee of Harrow Labour Party. As a result, Davies decided to contest the election as an "Independent Labour" candidate.

Underwood did not seek reselection as an official candidate of the Labour Party, as it had not been his intention to participate in the 1974 election. However, as a result of the decision of the Labour Party not to endorse Davies, Underwood decided to contest the election with him as an "Independent Labour" candidate. Their campaign slogan was "People before Party".

Underwood resigned from the Labour Party on polling day. Subsequent to the election, Davies was expelled from the Labour Party because he had contested an election in opposition to official Labour Party candidates.

In the early 1980s Davies' application to rejoin the Labour Party was accepted and he went on to represent Roxbourne ward as a Labour Councillor between 1990 and 1994.
