Note:

1986: Cervantes-Watson resigned from the Conservative Party in May 1987 and announced he would be voting for the SDP at the General Election. He cited the “dogmatic, arrogant and uncaring” approach of the Conservative Government as the reason for his resignation. He resigned from the Council’s Conservative Group in July 1987.

1994: Edey sought election as a “Keep Sunday Traditional — Stop Sunday Trading” candidate. Rogers resigned from the Conservative Party in September 1994 and joined the Liberal Democrats.
