Note: Beatty was disqualified under the terms of the Local Government Act 1894, section 46, sub-section 7, for his failure, throughout a period of six consecutive months, to attend any meetings of the Board or its committees. The Board was informed of Beatty's disqualification on 26 April 1906; no candidate was nominated to fill the casual vacancy so the Clerk was instructed on 24 May to communicate with the Middlesex County Council (MCC) on the matter. The MCC invited the remaining Guardians to propose the name of a person willing to accept office so that they could make an Order under the Local Government Act 1896. This resulted in Dale's appointment and he attended his first meeting of the Board on 30 August 1906.
