2011: (28/7) Versallion's resignation followed his election, in May 2011, as a councillor for the Heath and Reach ward of Central Bedfordshire Council.

Silver was a Conservative councillor for Headstone North ward between 1990-1994 and 1998-2010. He resigned from the Conservative Party prior to contesting the by-election.

2014: Although Ms. Robinson contested this election as an Independent candidate, she maintained her interest in 'green' issues, having told the local press in January 2014 that she was "very interested in sustainability issues in the Borough and doing more for the environment."
