### THE MAY 2014 REGISTER OF ELECTORS: INTRODUCTION, RAYNERS LANE WARD ANALYSIS AND LIST OF POLLING DISTRICTS

#### Scope

A *Register of Electors* contains the names, in street order, of all persons entitled to vote at Parliamentary and Local Government elections. (Anonymous registration is available to people meeting certain statutory requirements where, if their name or address were listed on the *Register of Electors*, their safety would be at risk.)

Harrow's May 2014 *Register*, to be used at the Borough and European Parliament Election of 22 May 2014, was issued by Hugh Peart, the Electoral Registration Officer for the London Borough of Harrow, from his department at the Civic Centre, Station Road, Harrow, and came into force on 1 April 2014.

#### Dates

Up to 2001, a revised *Register* was published on 15 February each year, based on a qualifying date of 10 October (and a draft *Register* published on 28 November) the previous year. From 2001, as a result of the Political Parties, Elections and Referendums Act 2000, the annual 'revised' *Register* is published on 1 December, although it is possible to update the *Register* with new names each month between January and September. Additionally, the Returning Officer is able to issue a "Notice of Change" as late as 9 pm on the day of election in order to correct a clerical error in the *Register*. Such alterations can be made by virtue of Section 13B(3B) or 3(D) of the Representation of the People Act 1983 (as amended).

#### Qualifications

The right to register for voting extends to all British, Republic of Ireland, Commonwealth and European Union citizens. British citizens living overseas may register for up to 15 years after they were last registered at an address in the UK. (Overseas electors are only qualified to vote in Parliamentary and European Parliamentary Elections.) It is possible for someone to register before their 18th birthday as long as they will reach that age before the next revision of the *Register*.

#### Marked Names

- E** Printed before a name indicates an Overseas elector who is also a Peer or Peeress, only registered to vote at European Parliamentary Elections.
- F** Printed before a name indicates an Overseas elector only registered to vote at Parliamentary and European Parliamentary Elections.
- G** Printed before a name indicates a European Union Citizen elector only registered to vote at Local Government Elections.
- K** Printed before a name indicates a European Union Citizen elector only registered to vote at Local Government and European Parliamentary Elections. (Registering as a European Parliamentary elector is entirely voluntary for citizens of EU member states: the letter therefore indicates that the elector has individually applied to be registered.)
- L** Printed before a name indicates an elector, usually a Peer or Peeress, not entitled to vote in respect of that entry at a Parliamentary Election.

#### Dated Names

A number printed immediately before an elector's name indicates the eighteenth birthday of the voter, meaning that he or she had reached voting age on that day, and would be able to vote at elections held on or after that day. For example, a marking of 6/7 meant that the elector would be able to vote at elections held on or after 6 July 2014 (and so would not be able to vote on 22 May) whilst one of 15/2 meant that the elector would be able to vote at elections held on or after 15 February 2014.

## Rayners Lane Ward Analysis

The effect of the various markings in the *Register* of a typical ward in Harrow — Rayners Lane — is the subject of this section of the Appendix. Three (WU, WUA and WUB) of the four polling districts that make up the ward have been studied in detail.

### Effect of 'Inserted' Names

The 'base' number of entries for each polling district is the highest numerical entry in that section of the *Register of Electors*. The total number of names for each polling district is in fact slightly higher than the base number due to insertions made under the revising, 'rolling register', arrangements described earlier. Such entries receive a polling number such as 974/1, 974/2, 1471/1 etc. at their point of insertion.

For the whole of the London Borough of Harrow there were 182,111 electors eligible to vote in the Borough Election and 170,864 for the European Parliament election. The difference (11,247, 6.18%) was caused, apart from a handful of Overseas electors, by European Citizen electors marked G in the *Register*.

## Appendix T

### HONORARY ALDERMEN OF THE LONDON BOROUGH OF HARROW

Aldermen were abolished under the Local Government Act 1972. However section 249(1) of the Act created a statutory right for London Borough councils to confer the title "Honorary Alderman" on a person who had rendered eminent service as a past member who was no longer a member. The title remained for life.

Since then, two Honorary Aldermen have been created in Harrow. **Albert Keith Toms** was appointed in July 2006. He had served as a councillor for 32 continuous years: from 1974-1978 in Harrow Weald ward and from 1978-2006 in Kenton East ward.

In June 2014 **Richard David Romain** was appointed Harrow's second Honorary Alderman. He too had served for 32 continuous years as a councillor: from 1982-1986 in Stanmore South ward and from 1986-2014 in Canons ward.

Honorary Aldermen receive invitations to all Civic and social events and can represent the Mayor of Harrow, and the Borough, at public functions.
